The eigenface approach and the Fisher face method are two common face recognition pattern algorithms that have been developed. Recognition of facial images The Eigenface approach is based on the reduction of face dimensional space for facial traits using Principal Component Analysis (PCA). The major goal of applying PCA on face recognition was to generate Eigen faces (face space) by identifying the eigenvector corresponding to the face image's biggest eigenvalue. According to the UK Daily Mail, police data show that about 31 percent of house break-ins occurs between 1:00 AM and the late sunrise, dubbed "the hour of thieves." (Satari et al., 2014), That is why steps have been made to reduce such occurrences, but first, allow me to inform you [1-5].

What's up? To assist a person in recognizing who is visiting their houses and to alert authorities if a suspicious person comes by. Or, even better, to assist those who are visually handicapped or who suffered from amnesia in earlier events. A billion-dollar industry is built around the concept of "security," a primary word that has represented one of the major issues since the ancient times when cavemen were trying to figure out how to secure their food to our current time where security intervenes on a daily basis. According to a Statista research paper, this industry cost 12.1 billion u.s. dollars in 2020 and is projected to increase to nearly billion us dollars by 2025 (Norval, & Prasopoulou, 2017).

Our fear of crime has been and continues to be a key issue for many countries attempting to combat it. Because of this anxiety, an increase in the purchase of home security systems has demonstrated a readiness to prevent crime and violence. Over the last two decades, researchers have focused on the elements that have a significant impact on the type of crime. These studies include (Hale, 1996; Lupton & Tulloch, 1999; Farrall & Gadd, 2004; Moore & Shepherd, 2007), among others. Despite the fact that such studies have provided insight on the nature of crime, they have disregarded the importance of home security systems in deterring crime [6-10]. As a consequence, I placed a premium on such systems in my study (Satari et al. 2014; Pawar et al., 2018).

As previously said, various hypotheses have been advanced on how crime was reduced in the recent decade due to improving elements such as economic, social, and environmental. The graphic above shows how the growing use of home security systems has certainly reduced the ratio of crimes. This project is about home - or organization - security using facial recognition. According to the strategy, this system was separated into five tasks in this project:

- The first duty is to get an image of whoever is standing at the door or waiting for permission.
- The second goal is to use face recognition to identify the individual.
- Third, make a judgment on whether or not to allow such individual authorization.
- Fourth, notify the homeowner or the person in control whether the individual is recognized or not, as well as the authorization status.
- Fifth task: Allow the homeowner or the person in control to manually grant authorization to unidentified persons.

## Aims and Goals

The purpose of this project that I'm presenting is to design a home security system that includes a CCTV camera that captures a picture of the person at the door so that they may be identified facially afterwards. This will provide the necessary protection for the home owner and keep him awake in the event of a burglary or other undesired activity. A remote access system will give the homeowner with

a regulated environment that will improve his level of life, protect him, and aid him in his everyday activities.

Many flaws in previous systems have been found, such as problems detecting and categorizing people in low or dim lighting, poor image capture quality, the cost of training the database, and so on. The bulk of the flaws in the previous systems, however, are addressed in this research. The ultimate aim is to minimize the quantity of photographs required for training and to notify the administrator as soon as the individual is detected (Satari, 2014; McClellan, 2019).

## Difficulties

The main issue that faced me was the lack of experience in this project field due to my lack of interest and lack of information, which resulted in increasing the scale of researches and information gathering about each of the specific tasks. Furthermore, one of the challenges encountered is a lack of practical experiences since, as previously stated, I focused more on the theoretical side of my studies in most of my studies, thus I had limited access to the practical field, which was done in a small number of courses throughout time. The technical issues were identifying and selecting the proper hardware and software that would be suited for the homeowner and whether it would fulfill his demands or not, as it is not a standard home security system, but rather a more advanced system that performs a more complex duty.

Moreover, technical difficulties with the facial identification system are that the system requires a high level of accuracy, which can be affected by a variety of conditions, such as the individual's pose difference, which can affect the face scan, and the expression of the human's face, which usually changes due to the state of emotions, which can affect the scan. Several difficulties were uncovered during the examination of past studies. overcoming standardized facial image classification difficulties, incorporating face pattern harvesting and similarity analysis, recovering nearby facial images that genuinely align its query, harvesting precise and reliable or right characteristics from low quality or blurred images, even if images captured in poor lighting are only a small portion of them (Nigam et al. 2021; Kostka et al. 2021).

## Regarding the notification part the possible difficulties were:

## 1. False alarms

Erroneous alarms arise as a result of incorrect system operations; they occur less commonly when the system has a minor malfunction, leading the message to be false.

## 2. System dysfunction

The system may shut down for unknown reasons, leading the notice to be deactivated, resulting in poor protection for the owner.

## 3. Owner notifications

The owner may encounter a circumstance in which the notifications do not reach; for example, if the owner's phone runs out of power or is in quiet mode, the incoming notice will not be read.

## 4. Maintenance

Such systems need constant maintenance in order for the system to be effective and error-free, as well as to avoid breakdowns that result in negative withdrawals.

## 5. Power

To work, the notification system requires constant electricity and internet access. The system will not work if any of the connections fails, the cameras will disconnect owing to the power connection

shutting down, and the notice will not reach the owner at the specified time due to the internet connection failing.

#### 6. Other creatures disturbing the motion detector

Other organisms, such as animals, may interfere with and upset the motion detector, resulting in erroneous detection and incorrect warning to the homeowner.

## **BACKGROUNS/ RELATED WORK**

#### **Definitions of Artificial Intelligence**

Artificial intelligence (AI) is the ability of a computing device or a computer-controlled robot to perform tasks commonly associated with intelligent beings. The term typically refers to the effort to create systems with human-like mental abilities, such as the ability to reason, uncover meaning, generalize, or learn from past experience. Since the advent of digital computer in the mid-1950s, it has been demonstrated that computers can be trained to execute highly complex tasks with great competence, such as finding proofs for logical theories or playing chess. Nonetheless, despite ongoing increases in the computer's speed of processing and the capacity of the memories, it is impossible for

a program to match the human flexibility across broader areas or even to compete in activities that requires a high level of everyday knowledge.

On the other hand, some programs have surpassed the performance levels of human experts and professionals in performing specific tasks, so artificial intelligence in this limited sense can be found in applications ranging from medical diagnosis to computer search engines to voice or handwriting recognition [11-15].

#### History of The Development of A.I

Alan Matheson Turing, a British logician and computer developer, pioneered the scope of A.I in the midmost of the twentieth decade. Turing created an abstracted computing machine around 1935, consisting of an endless memory and a scanner that scans the memory symbol by symbol, reading what it finds and writing new symbols. The scanner's operations are governed by an instruction program, which is also stored in memory in the form of symbols. Turing's stored-program notion implies that the machine may operate on its own program, changing or improving it. The universal Turing machine is the name given to Turing's notion. All current computers are, in essence, universal Turing machines. Turing worked as a cryptanalyst at the Code of Government and the School of Cypher in Bletchley Park, Buckingham, England, during WWII. Turing was unable to begin work on the notion of constructing a stored-program digital computing system until World War II ended in 1945. Despite this, he attached great importance to machine intelligence throughout the duel. Donald Michie, Turing's colleague at Bletchley Park, recalls Turing constantly explaining how computers might acquire knowledge as well as solve new issues using guiding principles, a method now known as heuristic problem solving.

Turing presented what was most likely the first public presentation on computer intelligence in London in 1947, telling, "What we want is a machine that can learn from experience," and that the "possibility of allowing the machine change its very own commands gives the comprehensive framework for this." And at 1948, he defined a lot of the key ideas of Artificial Intelligence in a work called "Intelligent Machinery." on the other hand, he did not release this essay, and several of his insights were later reproduced by others. As mentioned in the section Connectionism, one of his early motifs was to intern a network of artificial neurons to perform certain functions.

Turing prophesied in 1945 that computers would one day be capable of playing extremely strong chess. Deep Blue, a Global Business Machines Corporation (IBM) chess computer, defeated the incumbent world grandmaster, Garry Kasparov, in a 6-game battle just over half a century later, in 1997. While Turing's forecast that chess scripting would help us learn how some people thought didn't even come true. Deep Blue's 256 simultaneous CPUs permitted it to assess 200 million alternative plays per sec and see up to Fourteen turns of play ahead. Many get along with MIT linguist Noam Chomsky. He claims that computers that beat the Grandmaster in chess are as amazing as bulldozers that win the Olympic weightlifting tournament.

## The Turing Test

Around 1950, Turing avoided the conventional argument over the concept of intelligence by developing the Turing test, a practical evaluation of computer intelligence which is now known colloquially as that of the Turing test. A computer, a person interrogator, and a human foil are used in the Turing test. The interrogator seeks to discover which of the two people is the computer by interrogating the other two participants. The keypad and display screen are used for all communication. The interrogator may ask as many penetrating and broad-ranging inquiries as he or

she like, and the computer may do what it takes to generate a false identity. (For example, in response to the query, "Are you really a computer?" the computer may say, "No," and then react to a query to reduplicate a gigantic figure by another with a lengthy delay and false result.) Foil should help the questioner make an accurate identification. A variety of population perform the part of interrogator and foil, and if a large number of the interrogators are still unable to differentiate a computer from a normal human being, the computer is considered an intelligent, thinking organism (according to Turing's test supporters). Hugh Loebner, an American philanthropist, founded the yearly Loebner Prize competition in 1991, giving a prize of \$100,000 to the 1st computer to finish the Turing test and giving an amount of \$2,000 to the top attempt each year. Yet, no Artificial Intelligence software got close to finishing a pure test.

#### How Does A.I Imitates Humans?

Artificial Neural Networks (ANNs) are computing systems made up of linked components called artificial neurons that are modeled after human brain neurons. These neurons are built up of dozens, if not hundreds, of linked layers of algorithms.

## **History of Facial Recognition Systems**

A technology-based way of recognizing a human face is known as facial recognition. A face recognition system maps facial characteristics from an image or video using biometrics. It compares the information to a database of known faces to determine a match. Facial recognition can aid in the verification of a person's identification. The history of face recognition may be traced back to the 1960s. That's when mathematician and computer scientist Woodrow Wilson Bledsoe devised a measuring technique that could be used to categorize images of people's faces. Bledsoe is considered as the unofficial father of face recognition technology as a result of his work. Bledsoe's work piqued the curiosity of law enforcement officials. And, from the 1970s to the 1990s, government agencies

created their own facial recognition systems. These were primitive in comparison to today's technology, but the work on these systems paved the groundwork for contemporary facial recognition algorithms.

Many consider 2001 to be a watershed moment in the history of face recognition technology. That's when law enforcement officers at Super Bowl XXXV employed face recognition to assist identify persons in the crowd. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office in Florida built its own face recognition database the same year. However, it wasn't until the 2010s that computers were sophisticated enough to make face recognition a more common function. In reality, face recognition software proved terrorist Osama bin Laden's identity in 2011. In 2015, the Baltimore Police Department utilized face recognition to identify protesters after Freddie Gray was deceased due to a spinal injury while being transferred in a police van.

Customers are actively using face recognition on their phones as well as other personal gadgets. In 2015, Windows Hello and Android's Trusted Face enabled users to log into their smartphones by merely pointing them at their faces. In 2017, Apple's iPhone X debuted its Face ID face recognition technology. This technology has sparked debate, with detractors claiming that it violates people's privacy. Cities like San Francisco, Oakland, and Boston has outlawed the use of face recognition by governments. And, following Black Lives Matter rallies against police brutality in the summer of 2020, numerous corporate behemoths, including Amazon, Microsoft, and IBM, stated that they would no longer sell facial recognition software to law enforcement agencies [16-20].

#### How Does It Work?

You might be adept at identifying people's faces. You probably have no trouble recognizing the face of a family member, friend, or acquaintance. You recognize their face characteristics — their eyes, nose, and mouth — and how they work together.

That is how a facial recognition system operates on a larger, algorithmic scale. Recognition technology sees data where you see a face. That information can be saved and retrieved. According to a Georgetown University research, half of all American adults have their photos recorded in one or more facial-recognition databases that law enforcement authorities can check.

So, how does face recognition function? Although technologies differ, the following are the basic steps:

A photo or video of your face is used to capture an image of your face. Your face might be seen alone or in a public. Your photograph might show you staring straight ahead or almost in profile.

The geometry of your face is read by facial recognition software. The distance across your eyes and the distance across your brow to your chin are important considerations. The program recognizes facial landmarks — one system recognizes 68 of them — that are important in differentiating your face. As a consequence, your face signature was created.

Your mathematical formula for a facial signature is matched to a database of known individuals. Consider the following: At least 117 million people in the United States have photos of their faces in one or more government databases. The FBI has accessibility to 412 million facial pictures for searches, as shown in a May 2018 report.

A decision has been made. Your faceprint could match one in a database of facial recognition systems.

#### How Accurate Is It?

Critics are concerned that face recognition might result in incorrect identifications. What if a police agency wrongly identifies someone smashing a store window throughout a riot as someone who was not near the event using face recognition technology? How probable is it that something will occur? That is conditional. According to the National institute of standards, the best face identification algorithm had an error rate of 0.08 percent as of April 2020. That's a significant improvement over 2014, when the highest accuracy had a 4.1 percent mistake rate.

According to a 2020 report by the Centre for Strategic & International Studies (CSI), accuracy is better when identification algorithms are used to match persons to clear, static photos, such as a passport photo or mugshot. According to the report, when applied in this manner, face recognition algorithms may get accuracy scores as high as 99.97 percent on the National Bureau of Standards and Technology's Facial Recognition Vendors Test. In practice, however, accuracy rates are typically lower. According to the CSI report, the Face Recognition Vendor Test discovered that the mistake rate for one algorithm increased from 0.1 percent when faces were matched to high-resolution mugshots to around 9.3% when faces were matched to the pictures of the people caught in public. Error rates increased when people were not looking straight at the camera or were partially covered by shadows or objects. Another issue is aging. According to the Facial Recognition Vendor Test, middle-tier recognition systems exhibited mistake rates that increased by roughly a factor of ten when attempting to match photographs of participants shot 18 years earlier.

#### **Face Recognition Systems Challenges**

As previously said, opportunities and challenges coexist. Rising business interest in face recognition is a positive thing, but it is also a challenging enterprise when it comes to the issues associated with it, which have continually limited its quality of service. These issues arise when the environment is unhelpful, leading in the numerous facial appearances/expressions.

The obstacles that are restricting the ability of a Facial Recognition Program to access the additional distance are listed below [20-25].

#### Illumination

Light fluctuations are abbreviated as illumination. A little shift in terms of lighting is a huge obstacle to facial detection & recognition and can also give a noticeable impact on the outcomes. If the illumination got replaced and the said person is photographed by similar sensors and nearly same face expressions & attitude, the outcomes might appear very varied. The appearance of the face is considerably altered by illumination. It's been revealed that the difference in the two identical faces photographed under different illumination conditions is bigger than the difference of the two separate faces photographed under same lighting conditions.

Illumination is an abbreviation for light fluctuations. A little change in lighting conditions is a considerable barrier to automatic face recognition and can have a big influence on its outcomes. If the lighting changes and the same person is caught with the same sensor and virtually similar face expressions & stance, the outcome might seem considerably varied. The look of the face is radically

altered by illumination. It was discovered that the dissimilarity across 2 identical faces taken under multiple illuminations is exceeding the difference between 2 distinct faces taken within similar lighting

## • Pose

Facial recognition frameworks are quite responsive to difference in posture. Persons face location differ as his or her head motion and viewing angle vary. Head motions or changing cam POVs will undoubtedly cause changes in facial look and intraclass variations, resulting in drastically lower automatic face recognition percentages. Recognizing the genuine face gets increasingly difficult as the angle of rotation rises. Errors or no recognition may occur if the dataset only contains a frontal shot of the face.

## Occlusion

Occlusion is described as an obstruction that occurs when one or more areas of the face are occluded, preventing the full face from being used as the input picture. one of the most major challenging struggles in facial recognition algorithms is Occlusion

• This occurs as a result of a beard, moustache, or accessories (protective glasses, cap, helmet, etcetera.), and it is common in real life situations. The inclusion of such features complicates the situation, rendering automatic facial recognition a difficult problem to solve.

## • Expressions

Facial expression is one of the most important biometric data since this distinctive trait are important in determining individual identifying and feelings. Diverse situations elicit various expressions, resulting in a spectrum of emotional responses and, subsequently, a shift in facial movements.

Additional factor worth examining is the many expressions of the very same person. Human expressions are instances of a person's reactions, particularly macro-expressions like as joy, grief, fury, disdain, fear, and surprise. Micro-expressions are quick facial patterns that arise unconsciously.

As a consequence of changes in one's emotional reaction, micro expressions and macro arise on a person's expression, and at the consequence of such sentiments, which are various, effective identification becomes difficult.

## Low Resolution

A common image must have a quality of at least 16\*pixel blocks. A low-resolution picture is one that has a resolution less than 16\*16. The low-quality photos may be acquired from standalone devices that are small-scaled such as city CCTV system, ATM cams, and supermarket security cameras. Because the camera is not particularly close to the face, such cams can only record a limited proportion of the physical facial area, and then only a face region with a pixel below 16\*. Because most of the characteristics get destroyed in such a little shot, it does not convey much information. It is conceivable that identifying people will be difficult.

## Aging
